




Through whole group and small group instructional settings, your child will explore a variety of genres this year. We will focus on:



If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 school days, and Student C will have read for 3.
