On another note...MOMO Challenge

As some of you may be aware, there has been national and international media coverage lately about a creepy internet challenge known as the "Momo Challenge." Allegedly, Momo targets children by encouraging them to text a number on popular online applications (e.g. YouTube, Minecraft, WhatsApp, etc.), which then sends them instructions to complete a series of increasingly bizarre and dangerous tasks from watching a horror movie to engaging in self-harm to taking their own lives. If this sounds familiar, this is similar to the "Slender Man" and "Blue Whale" internet trends in years past.

While there are reports that the threat of the Momo Challenge may be overstated, experts in mental health caution that the hysterical news coverage could potentially prove harmful, possibly even inspiring imitators. It can also cause some students to be fearful or anxious.

Our students are no different...I've already had several conversations with kids about MOMO and how they are scared of her. Please talk with your kiddos about the content they access, the importance of not accepting any communications or invitations from people they do not know, and not sharing personal information. Continue to have regular conversations with them about internet safety and monitor what's happening on their accounts. Ask open-ended questions that will help you to understand what your child is thinking and feeling.
