On Wednesday, our teachers will be working with trainers on restorative practices and trauma informed activities and supports. Restorative practice is a productive way to help students repair a relationship after a harm has been done. It goes beyond a simple "sorry" and helps both students recognize any and all harm that may have been caused by these actions. It also helps support kids who have hurt others to see the impact of their actions and that they have the power to reconnect and repair a situation. Our trauma informed practice will help our staff with mindful practices for themselves and students as they provide tools for all students to regulate their mind and body. It should be a great day of learning.

Unity Day is Wednesday 10/23...we wear Orange that day as a show of Unity against bullying behavior. Unity Day is a nationally recognized movement to bring awareness to Bully Prevention. We want to unite Westonka against bullying. At Shirley Hills we teach "Stop, Walk and Talk" as a strategy to stop bullying behavior as it is happening. Ask your child for the specifics of SWT...let me know if they don't know, I'll do a booster training for our school!

- At the next screen, enter your Skyward Login information. (If you don't have this information, please call Mrs. Clipper at 952-491-8409).
- If this is the first time you have tried to log into Family Access, the next screen that appears may ask you to change your password to something you can easily remember. Simply create a new password and click Save.
- When you get to your Family Access account, click on Teacher Conferences on the left side of the screen.
- If you have more than one child in the district, there will be a box for each student.
- To the far right of the student's name, click on All Conferences
- On the next screen, find the HOMEROOM class. This may be the only class listed or it may be the last one in a list of five.
- On the line with the Homeroom class, click Select a Time.
- The next screen shows all conference times. Any available conference time slot will have the word SELECT to the far right.
- Click on Select for a time that works for your family.
- A small screen will pop up showing the teacher's name, room number and the time you have selected. Click Save, and you're done.

LEVY INFORMATION

We are grateful for local support of Westonka Public Schools, which has brought positive growth, recognition and success to our students and community.

On Nov. 5, 2019, Westonka residents will be asked to vote on a "revoke and replace" levy with a tiered payment structure. If approved, all three of the district's current voter-approved levies will be revoked and replaced with a single, 10-year levy with a two-step increase. Instead of asking for a larger increase up front, this levy accesses funds only as they are needed by the district.

If the levy passes, the district will:

- Secure long-term funding to avoid impactful reductions
- Stay competitive with neighboring school districts in class sizes and programming
- Accelerate progress in Westonka's award-winning schools
- Maintain the lowest school taxes in Hennepin County

If the levy fails:

- **\$750,000 in reductions** will be needed for 2020-2021. One can expect the following impacts:
 - Administrative cuts. The first area of focus for reductions will be to minimize the cost of administration and operations (transportation, facilities, technology, utilities, etc.). Each year these budgets have been challenged, as the district makes annual reductions in this area.
 - Larger class sizes. The majority of district expense is classroom teachers. This reduction will push some primary class sizes to upper 20s, some middle school classes to mid 30s, and some high school to upper 30s.
 - Fewer electives. A reduction of teachers results in fewer course offerings. The number of course electives for students will be impacted. This will result in less diversity of classes to match student interests and abilities.
 - *Less student support.* The district will have fewer support staff, who are relied on for student safety, mental health, and smooth operations of schools.
 - **Activities reductions.** The number of coaches and middle school activities will likely be impacted by these reductions.
 - Limited professional development opportunities. The funding allocated to provide professional development to advance instruction and curriculum will reduce.
