Main Goals for Junior Year	
 ACADEMIC: Put forth best academic effort since this will be the last year of grades listed on the transcript that is submitted to colleges. POST-SECONDARY PLANNING: Research specific options in order to narrow your list of preferred schools to a manageable number by the beginning of senior year (3-5). 	
- ACT Testing	
It is recommended that students take the ACT for the first time in the second semester of their junior year. State/District Test - February 20 during school day vs. National Test Dates - 7 Saturdays throughout the year. There is a "plus writing" option: Some colleges/universities recommend or require the writing score. Check if your preferred college requires it The writing score does not factor into the cumulative score; it yields a separate score that colleges may use to consider readiness for	
college level writing and critical thinking
