Main Goals for Junior Year

- ACADEMIC: Put forth best academic effort since this will be the last year of grades listed on the transcript that is submitted to colleges.
- POST-SECONDARY PLANNING: Research specific options in order to narrow your list of preferred schools to a manageable number by the beginning of senior year (3-5).

ACT Testing

District ACT	National ACT Test
During the school day (ONLINE)	7 Saturday options throughout year
Offered only one time to junior students	Can take numerous times
\$20 cost	\$70 cost
Online registration - will be done through school	Online registration at <u>www.act.org</u>
Paper score report sent to student home, also available through online account created as part of preadministration.	Score report automatically linked to student online account.

22-23 ACT Exam Dates

December 10 (register by November 4)
February 11 (register by January 6)
March District ACT at MWHS
April 15 (register by March 10)
June 10 (register by May 5) @ MWHS
July 15 (register by June 16)

District ACT

- Offered to ALL junior students on March, 7th
- Online testing option only (will use Chromebook and lockdown browser)
- Includes writing test
- Yields a college reportable score
- Able to send that score to up to 4 colleges at no charge
- Cost: \$20. Paid through Fee Pay on Skyward Family Access.
 - If you have financial need (free/reduced lunch) there will be no charge.
- Registration instructions will come through counselors February 23.
 - You will NOT register online the same way you do for the national test dates.

Register early to have a better chance of testing at preferred location

MWHS is a test center on June 10, 2023 National test date (paper/pencil testing)

ACT Registration Details

- Students need to upload a photo when registering
 - That photo will be printed on the admission ticket and test roster
 - Students MUST present a photo ID on the day of the test
- Remember to use consistent identifying information
- Keep track of username and password when setting up the online account
- There is a "plus writing" option:
 - Some colleges/universities recommend or require the writing score.
 - The writing test is a part of the district test in March.
 - The writing score does not factor into the cumulative score; it yields a separate score

**Similar process is followed for the SAT.

- Most colleges have returned to traditional campus visit opportunities, but families should plan ahead as they can fill up quickly.

Testing Policies: Class of 2024

Test Optional: Student can supply an ACT/SAT score if it supports their application

Test Blind: Scores will not be reviewed in any capacity for the admissions process

Test Required: A score must be supplied at the time of application

Most colleges are remaining test optional through 2025

Testing Policies: Class of 2024

What if the ACT score is submission is option or blind?

- Students should assume other factors will play a bigger role in an admissions decision. This includes: GPA, Course Rigor, Recommendations, and Academic Interests
- Context factors include; commitment to community service and leadership, diversity that will strengthen a program or student body, significant family responsibilities, personal extenuating circumstances, information provide in the application

5 Month "To Do" List

- Consider which ACT test dates will be best for your child
- If there are schools that require the SAT, make plans to take it
- Utilize online resources to sort through college choices
- Schedule campus tours (virtua/in person)
- Encourage a rigorous schedule through 12th grade
- Attend Parent Night in February
 - ☐ We'll review application process for senior year
- Keep tabs on how school counselors are working with your student via the weekly newsletter

Going beyond admissions....getting ready for college

- Who is driving the college search/application process?
- ☐ Can your teen take responsibility for his/her self care?
- Can your teen manage time?
- Does your teen know how to seek help?
- Can your teen take responsibility for and learn from their poor decisions?
- Has your teen shown they can manage themselves in a setting without family?
- Can your teen assess risk?
- Does your child understand the financial investment of college?
