District unveils new logos, branding

After months of research, broad community input and careful design, we unveiled the new graphic identity of Westonka Public Schools in August. Some common themes emerged during the market research process from people's hopes for a refreshed look for the school district: name recognition, simplicity and consistency. Stakeholders emphasized the importance of a unified identity that would proudly represent Westonka to both internal and external audiences. Board to review school names

The branding review revealed significant inconsistencies in how individuals inside and outside our district refer to our schools. Mound, Mound Westonka, and Westonka are used interchangeably for both our high school and district. In the news media, we have been referred to as everything from Mounds/Westonka to Mound-WestTonka to West Mound Minnetonka. When people struggle to accurately remember our name, it signals that our brand identity is not as strong or clear as it should be.

The name Westonka is unique and has long been embraced by both for-profit and non-profit organizations to represent the cities along Lake Minnetonka's western shore. It also equally represents the eight lake communities within our school district boundaries. The proposed name changes will bring consistency and a sense of unity across our schools and community.

The Westonka School Board plans to take action on school names at the November 18, 2024 board meeting. The board will vote on a proposal to adopt Westonka Middle School and Westonka High School as the middle and high school names starting in the 2025-26 school year, while preserving our primary school names.

Our district's success today is built on the achievements and contributions of countless individuals who have walked the halls of our schools. As we engage in discussions about potential name changes, our goal remains: to proudly represent our entire community while honoring the rich history that defines us. Together, we continue to build on the legacy that the graduates of Mound High School and Mound Westonka High School created.

Construction has begun on several key projects across the Westonka District. We are grateful for the community's support of the 2023 bond referendum, which is allowing us to improve safety and security at all schools; address significant deferred maintenance needs of our 50- to 70-year-old buildings; and redesign the high school to enhance the learning environment and improve functionality, safety and pride.

The new tennis courts are scheduled to be fully complete next spring. The current courts will remain operational until the new courts are finished, avoiding impacts to the boys and girls tennis seasons. When the current courts are no longer needed, they will be removed in order to expand the high school's north parking lot.

Summer 2024 projects included security improvements at Hilltop and Shirley Hills primary schools and the Early Learning Center, as well as the start of construction of 12 new tennis courts (with six of these courts also lined for pickleball) across Sunnyfield Road E from the high school and maintenance to the district bus garage and parking lot.

Security improvements now complete include:

- **Lockdown capacity** - Buildings now have a centralized lockdown function that, at the push of a button, will immediately secure security doors and hallways and limit access by an intruder. Schools are also able to isolate specific areas within the building, providing public access only where it's needed.
- **Intrusion resistant glass** - Hardened glass in main entrances and other select areas will help prevent unauthorized access.
- **Door alerts and notification lights** - Alarms and strobes will activate when a locked door has been propped open or not fully closed. Alert lights will also be used in the event of a lockdown.

- Bidding opened for the high school project

- Bidding opens and closes for the middle school project
- Bidding closes for the high school project
- Design continues for the high school stadium and Shirley Hills and Hilltop deferred maintenance projects

SPRING 2025

- New tennis/pickleball courts set to open for school and community use
- Construction set to begin on the high school and middle school projects
